Cost to establish FarmStart

	WB	AL
Basic services	0	£2,600
Containers & Polytunnel	£12,000	£7,000
Tools & machinery	£10,000+	£6,500
Total	£22,000+	£16,000

Cost to run FarmStart

Wage	£19,000
Seeds, compost, materials	£2,300
External training & visits	£1500+
Other (certification)	£1500
Total	£25,000+

Cost to participant: £600 (£500 + vat)

Additional costs - project development & ongoing management & support

- Land not for long term use (yet)


