



(VACANT & DERELICT LAND)

Some land are green or brown sites that have been left to overgrow, including a 25 hectare site, previously agricultural land at Robroyston Oval, a 5.5 hectare site on former football pitches in Dawsholm Park in the West, and a 3.1 hectare site by the Riverside Museum on the Clyde
