INTRO TO PROJECT (HAMISH)

The UBI4Farmers campaign is a grassroots movement advocating for the implementation of a basic income for farmers, farmworkers and food producers in the United Kingdom. We believe that a UBI would provide much-needed financial security and support for those working in this vital industry, while also helping to ensure the long-term sustainability of agriculture in the UK. Our coalition includes farmers, food producers, community groups, and advocacy organisations who are committed to raising awareness about the benefits of a BI for the agriculture industry and working towards its implementation.



BASIC INCOME DEFINITON (GUY)

Basic Income Earth Network (BIEN), basic income characteristics:

1. Periodic : It is paid at regular intervals (for example every month), not as a one-off grant.

2. Cash payment : It is paid in an appropriate medium of exchange, allowing those who receive it to decide what they spend it on. It is not, therefore, paid either in kind (such as food or services) or in vouchers dedicated to a specific use.

3. Individual : It is paid on an individual basis—and not, for instance, to households. (in relation to this policy we recommend it would be paid to all farmworkers and food producers as well as farmers, not only those who own the land)

4. Universal : It is paid to all, without means test (in relation to this policy we recommend the basic policy income would be paid to the full range of farmers from small-scale to large-scale)

5. Unconditional : It is paid without a requirement to work or to demonstrate a willingness to work (in relation to this scheme we recommend there would be a
