Littleton Farm

- West coast of Scotland
- Total farm area 136Ha.
- 117Ha is pasture, 14Ha woodland.
- Glacial till clay 22% across farm, sandier towards the sea, siltier away from it.
- 40m-145m above sea-level
- 30 yr average rainfall is 1072mm.





Cows & Grazing

- 40-50 cows + followers
- Mixture of Aberdeen Angus and Hereford - traditional types
- Breeding for a hardy maternal cow
- PFL certified farm
- 45-day bulling period
- Calve from mid-April; wean in Feb/Mar.
- Daily moves and long rest periods
- All animals outwintered on deferred grazing with supplementary bales when the cows tell us they need them!










